Southwest Housing Review

Residents, businesses and other stakeholders are invited to share their vision for the future of Southwest Coquitlam as the City prepares to chart a renewed course for the area's housing, transportation and neighbourhoods.

Public consultation has launched for the Southwest Housing Review (SWHR), which will focus on the 38-square-kilometre area south of Barnet Highway that is home to some of Coquitlam's most established and primarily single-family neighbourhoods. Input will be collected through an online engagement page and

survey, public information sessions, stakeholder engagement sessions and other means.

This will be the first of several opportunities to provide input into the SWHR, an intensive two-year planning process that aims to create more affordable housing, sustainable transportation and active corridors, and livable neighbourhoods for families.

During this first round of consultation, which is part of the first of five phases, the City is seeking public input on the values and objectives of the SWHR, including establishing a future vision for Southwest Coquitlam and considering the housing needs in low-density areas and along major road corridors.

The feedback received from this initial round of consultation will inform the approaches in the SWHR's subsequent phases.

In the Neighbourhood

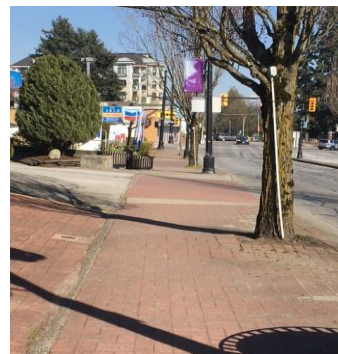
Repaving

The Decaire street repaving is complete and the city plans to repave two high-volume areas in the Spring 2021: Road repaving will take place on Brunette Avenue from Bernatchey Street to Lougheed Highway. Sidewalks will be replaced on Brunette Ave between Lougheed Highway and Woolridge street. Currently there are unsightly power bars hanging off the trees on the north and

south side of Brunette. They were installed as part of a plan for lighting the trees that was never executed. The MRA, along with local businesses are working with the city with the hope that lighting can be installed with the new sidewalks. Email your support to maillardvilleresidents@gmail.com

Aggressive Driving

A file was opened by the MRA with the RCMP regarding issues relating to speeding and aggressive driving on Brunette Avenue. While there have been many traffic accidents in the area, including a fatality and a fire hydrant being taken out around Hillside School during the past year, there appears to be little to no measures taken to deter speeders. In addition to safety concerns, aggressive driving also creates
